

WWII HRS Scholarship 2014

In 2010 the membership approved the creation of an HRS scholarship. The effort behind the scholarship was twofold. The primary goal is to assist the younger members of our organization in their pursuit of higher education. Obviously historical reenacting is an expensive hobby that can be a near impossibility for some students. Secondly we will help grow interest in historical reenacting as an educational endeavor which is part of the mission of our Society. The scholarship will be awarded to a full time undergraduate or graduate student majoring in areas such as history, museum studies, or archeology however all students are encouraged to apply. The award can be used towards tuition or books. Note that any family or relations to any of the board of directors or staff of the WWII HRS will be ineligible for this award.

Please send the applications to the WWII HRS Vice President. The amount of the award is \$500.

Eligibility:

- 1. Must be a current member of HRS in good standing in at least their second year of membership.
- 2. Must be registered as a full-time student; undergraduate or graduate; at an accredited college or university.
- 3. Must demonstrate a minimum GPA of 2.75.
- 4. Must currently be a history or associated major, however if there is not any history or associated major that apply then all majors are eligible.
- 5. Must not have received a previous HRS scholarship.

Requirements:

The student should write a 500-word essay describing their qualifications and justification for receiving the HRS scholarship. It should also include the student's future plans in reenacting. A letter of recommendation from their unit commander should also be included. If the student is the unit commander for their unit, then another commander can supply the letter. Unofficial transcripts or a letter for the college or university stating that the student's current major and GPA needs to be included. Lastly, a picture in WWII uniform should be included.

Deadline: July 1 Notification: August 1

An article highlighting the student will be in the Society publication, The Edge.

Review:

A committee consisting of an Allied, an Axis, and a Commonwealth member will review all candidates and give recommendation to the President who will be awarded the scholarship.

NOTICE FROM The Vehicle S&A Committee April 2014

The HRS currently has 206 WW2 vehicles, armor & misc. artillery and equipment registered. Event coordinators can get contact info for this equipment by contacting the HRS vehicle coordinator at hiawathajim@yahoo.com.

The Vehicle S&A Committee would also like to announce that S&A inspections of vehicles will be done at all HRS events starting with the 2014 season.

Vehicle Safety regulations can be found on the HRS WEB Site. Authenticity regulations for vehicles are currently in the works and will be posted soon. This is being done to further concrete the excellent safety record of the HRS.

The vehicle committee is also seeking applicants for doing vehicle inspections at events, the more inspectors we have the less time it will take for everyone involved. Those interested should send their info to hiawathajim@yahoo.com.

The vehicle committee is also seeking heavy weapons, machine gun crews, mortar teams & field artillery. These items will be added to the list so that event coordinators' know what is available for events. If you have any of these please send info to hiawathajim@yahoo.com.

VEHICLE SAFETY

- 1. All motor vehicles must be driven by a licensed driver, regardless of off or on road use. The driver must be knowledgeable of the type of vehicle he is driving. PROPER LIABILITY INSURANCE IS MANDATORY. Any vehicle driven off road MUST HAVE A GROUND GUIDE, to avoid personnel hiding in foliage.
- 2. Service brakes shall function on all wheeled vehicles.
- **3.** Emergency brakes (parking brakes) should be functional, if a vehicle was originally equipped with such brakes.
- 4. Tires shall have a minimum tread depth of 2/32 inches.
- **5.** Tracks shall be properly adjusted.
- **6.** Steering system shall be functional.
- **7.** Lighting shall be operational if used for night operation.
- **8.** Each vehicle shall be equipped with a current UL listed class BC fire extinguisher, rated for vehicular fires.
- **9:** Batteries must be properly secured to the vehicle.
- **10:** Maximum vehicle speed on the battlefield is 10 m.p.h.



InsuranceFrequently Asked Questions

What kind of insurance does the WWII HRS carry?

The HRS carries Liability Insurance. It is good in the lower 48 states.

Who is the insurance carrier?

Essex Insurance Company.

What is the term of the insurance?

2/1/2014 to 2/1/2015

Is the HRS insurance personal accident insurance or medical insurance?

No.

Are those under age 18 covered under our policy?

Yes, those under age 18 are covered although some restrictions still apply to minors.

What are the limits?

\$1,000,000; \$5000 medical expense limit for any one person.

Are vehicles, landing craft, and aircraft covered by the HRS insurance?

No they are not.

Does the insurance bar Canadian members?

What if my equipment or vehicle is lost, stolen, or damaged?

There is no coverage for personal property loss of any kind

Can my event get insurance coverage?

Yes, if an HRS chartered unit sponsors the event and it is approved by the HRS board however some restrictions apply.

The event site says they need to be added as an additional named insured to a certificate of insurance for my event.

Our insurance for 2014 has a blanket additional named insured so this does not incur an additional cost as in previous years however you still need to apply for this with enough time to process the request. At least 60 days should be allowed for the request.

Can I see proof of insurance for the HRS?

Yes, please contact a board member for more information.

Do non-members attending a WWII HRS event need to provide their own insurance for the event?

No. They are covered under the HRS insurance as part of the event.

Are HRS members covered at non-HRS sanctioned events?

No. The HRS insurance only applies at HRS sanctioned events.

Directions: The Fox River Trolley Museum is located on Illinois Route 31, three blocks south of State Street in South Elgin, IL. at Fox River Trolley Museum, 365 South LaFox Street (Illinois Route 31), South Elgin, IL 60177

- From Chicago and the east: Take the Northwest Tollway (I-90) or US Route 20 west to Elgin. - Exit on Illinois 31 southbound and follow posted detour at Spring Street (South Elgin).
- From the west and northwest: Take the Northwest Tollway (I-90) or US Route 20 east to Elgin. Exit on Illinois 31 southbound and follow posted detour at Spring Street (South Elgin).
- From the south: Take Illinois Route 59 north to Illinois Route 64. Turn west on 64 to Illinois Route 31 in St Charles. Take 31 north to the museum.

Authenticity Notes: HRS safety and authenticity rules apply.

Invited Vehicles/Items: All WWII vehicles, including tracked vehicles, are welcome; weather conditions permitting, tracked vehicles may be limited to the gravel road and battle field. Smaller vehicles such as Jeeps, Motorcycles, Kubels & Lightweight Trucks may drive on the grassy areas. A static vehicle honor display area has been established for all attending vehicles. Boats and other period water crafts such rafts are also welcome on the Fox River, but should contact us first prior to bringing out. River depth is only 2-3 feet in the vicinity of the museum.

Restrictions on Minors: HRS Rules

Other restrictions: No alcoholic beverages permitted in the Museum and County Park. No digging, but camp fires are allowed in above pits and military stoves and grills. No firing of weapons in the encampment area in County Park by Forest Preserve Ordinance; but okay in the designated battlefield areas on museum property.

All HRS members are invited to the 4th annual Fox River Trolley Museum's "Rails To Victory" WW2 Reenactment this June to remember and honor the men and women who fought on D-Day 70 years ago. Rails To Victory (RTV) offers opportunities for many diverse impressions and displays. The heart of the event is centered around providing the public with an immersive WW2 experience offering reenactors opportunities to put the public right into the middle of the action. During the Trolley Adventure, reenactors can participate in bridge skirmishes, partisan actions, period civilian impressions and various D-Day and Occupied France scenes and tableaus. The public rides through our battles and period scenes on one of the museum's three period trolleys.

The Fox River Trolley Museum located in the Village of South Elgin, Illinois in the Fox River Valley offers some interesting terrain for a more secluded battle area. Two interesting bridges are fought around and under; the CN Rail Trestle and the Stearns Road Stone Arches Bridge. The terrain is sloped in many places and has plenty of foliage. A large portion of the museum's 3 mile rail system snakes its way through the Kane County Forest Preserve along the Fox River.

From the homepage:



Vendor Feedback Reviews are posted only after being reviewed by the webmasters. Positive reviews are posted as they are submitted; negative reviews are posted 2 weeks after submission. During this time, the vendor is sent the review in order to provide them ample time to provide us with a rebuttal. After 2 weeks if no rebuttal is received the review is posted.

Vendors who do not recall the buyer are encouraged to make contact and work out the problem.

Spread the word! The RCG has not only helped WWII reenacting by spreading the word about bad vendors and experiences, but it has also really helped new vendors get discovered and their businesses grow. What it really means is that if a vendor screws someone, then it will be out there for everyone to see. And yes, vendors CAN rebut feedback. Be polite, no flames and be professional!!"

Reading of the February, 2014 Minutes:

The February, 2014 meeting minutes were read by Ron Kapustka. A motion was made by Ron Kapustka to approve the minutes as read, which was seconded by Wayne McCulley. A vote was taken and the Minutes were approved as read.

Old Business

2014 Membership Process: The 2014 procedure was discussed by Wayne McCulley. The minor forms have been handled, about 18 so far. There are 620 total members; with about a dozen or so that were manually entered by Wayne.

New Business

Unit Charters:

New Charters: The Polish 10th Dragoons have passed the S&A Committee. Jon Stevens made a motion to accept them as a Probationary Unit, which was seconded by Ron Kapustka. A vote was taken and the motion was passed. The Unit will be accepted as a Probationary Unit in the HRS.

The 3rd Infantry Division, 15th Regt., B **Probationary Charters:** Company was a "tie" in the S&A Committee. Mike recommended them as a Probationary Unit and asked for a motion. A discussion was held regarding the reason for the "tie" which was due to their footwear, which was a Korean War era boot. Doug Loge discussed the reasons to call for a vote tonight. Jon Stevens asked for comments from the BOD. Jon suggested that the Unit be probationary for another year. Rey Rameriz commented that the "boot issue' has been resolved and the M1943 "two-buckle" field boot was adopted as their only approved footwear. Rey discussed the attributes of the Unit and that he felt the Unit was deserving of a vote as a fully chartered Unit in the HRS. Doug asked Mike if he was asking for a Board vote. 

World War 1 Event News By Dave Fornell

A large number of WWI re-enactors at the April 2014 Rockford, Illinois Midway Village Museum Event were/are HRS members, including many members of the 9th US Infantry, 353rd Infantry, 12th SS, Duke of Cornwall, 2nd Panzer, 5th SS, 82nd AB, 2629th WAC, WAVES, and the 509th PIR.

PUBLIC NUMBERS

Despite the crappy weather, the museum reports they still had 1,400 paid spectators. Last year there were 1,500 for the WWI weekend, but we also had better weather then. For comparison the museum's sock monkey event (Rockford is the original home of the sock monkey for those who didn't know) had about 1,000 and its Scarecrow event gets about 600. So, this is a large event for the museum.

WWII Days in September is approaching closer to 10,000 spectators, which is by far the largest event the museum hosts, so it may take some time to build up to that level. However, one must remember the WWII Days event started with just 50 re-enactors and today it has grown to more than 1,100. WWI Days started out last year with twice that number.

Final re-enactor attendee count of those actually onsite for the 2014 World War 1 event was 197, which includes both period civilian and military impressions.

Thank you to all those who held out for the rainy Sunday portion of the event and for keeping displays open until the museum closed it early. Despite the rain we still had a couple hundred spectators Sunday. The question is who is more crazy, the re-enactors for doing this event in the rain or the spectators who brought their kids out to watch us in the rain?

Also, I wanted to thank all those who helped early with the continued trench work, setting up wire entanglements, aid for food prep in the cafe and help closing the trench at the end of the weekend.

DRK in the 353rd Infantry /Civilian for WWII and Civilian/Suffrage Movement WWI

When I was little, I remember my dad watching movies like the Longest Day, Battle Ground and Bridge on the River Kwai. I never really understood about the real aspects of WWII but I also had a German Grandmother and she never talked about living here during WWII and how it affected her and her Parents. I was fascinated by the fact her father fought in WWI as we had many photos of him in uniform and my grandmother always insisted My Great Grandfather contracted Diphtheria while in the trenches and spent the rest of the war in a hospital and that is why my family are all here!

My Great Grandfather and Great Grandmother were amateur actors back in Germany and that was how they met. My Great Grandfather continued to put on plays and perform for the wounded at the hospital. I believe that is where my interest to reenact has come from but with WWII, I began to have a more Hollywood style love affair with it especially after seeing the Band of Brothers. The longer I have been reenacting, my eyes have opened up to certain aspects of how women and choosing a civilian impression are treated. I think for me, I am the exception of the rule but I know of others who feel it is always an uphill battle, no pun intended, for the respect and acceptance. So I have decided to take a deeper look at this as I have many friends now in most of the units, I hope to observe this situation without casting judgment. I wouldn't say that I felt the women who are in this community are unhappy miserable ladies, not at all but from what I have pick up so far, situations have occurred that have made it difficult for the women. There is no doubt that the view that women should not be involved in reenacting period does float around many of the units. Although, I myself, have not encountered any resentment or been flat out told by anyone to leave just because I am a woman.

It is a fact that civilians especially the European, French civilians and German DRK's(German Red Cross) did hang around soldiers when called for, at the right times but I can see the point of view of this when the soldiers from both axis and allied are drilling or on the battle field, then they should not. I have not seen any civilians hanging around unwanted and at these times as I feel there is a respect of knowing what is real and should be done right for representing war time. I also have noticed that this community is small and people as people either like each other or not and I think that is just human nature and nothing to do with man vs. women in the reenacting world.

In an ideal world, everyone should get along and there should be peace, harmony and love but that isn't realistic and it goes for the reenacting world too. For what it's worth, I only hope that we all just remember why we do this, what brings us to spend all this time and money and lose our weekends is all about. That is something we all have in common and all share even if we all don't get along.

Over the coming months, as the season gets into full swing, I hope to just state the facts of what I may experience or what I see and how the opinions of my fellow reenactors feel over being a woman or a man in a hobby that is stated and is basically defined as a man's world. So for those of you who know me, and those of you who don't, please feel free to talk to me about this situation and each month, I can bring to table the concerns or joys we all have over this subject!
