



Shown above is a fully restored and operational 1945 vintage LCVP often called a "Higgins Boat' since many were made by the Higgins Boat Company in New Orleans. In fact several boat manufactures made the LCVP including Owens Yacht Company and the Chris-Craft Yacht Company. The landing craft could carry a jeep and a towed gun or a platoon of soldiers.

This particular boat was constructed with an outer skin of plywood while others were constructed with traditional planks. The bow numbers identify the particular boat. In this case, the mother ship is AKA16 (attack transport number 16 - USS Aquarius) and the boat number is 12 of approximately 15.
