

WWII HRS Scholarship 2016

In 2010 the membership approved the creation of an HRS scholarship. The effort behind the scholarship was twofold. The primary goal is to assist the younger members of our organization in their pursuit of higher education. Secondly we desire to grow interest in historical reenacting as an educational endeavor which is part of the mission of our Society. The scholarship will be awarded to a full time undergraduate or graduate student. The preferred majors are history, museum studies, or archeology however all HRS member students are encouraged to apply. The award can be used towards tuition or books and will be paid to the student's college or university to be credited to their account. Note that any family or relations of any board of directors or staff of the WWII HRS will be ineligible for this award.

Please send the applications to the WWII HRS Vice President. The amount of the award is \$500.

Eligibility:

- 1. Must be a current member of the WWII HRS in good standing in at least their second year of membership.
- 2. Must provide proof of being a full-time student, undergraduate or graduate, at an accredited college or university.
- 3. Must demonstrate a minimum GPA of 2.75.
- 4. Must currently be a history or associated major, however if there is not any history or associated major that apply then all majors are eligible.
- 5. Must not have been awarded a previous WWII HRS scholarship.

Requirements:

- 1. The student should write a 500-word essay describing their qualifications and justification for receiving the HRS scholarship including the student's future plans in reenacting.
- 2. A letter of recommendation from the student's unit commander. If the student is the unit commander, then another unit commander acquainted with the student can supply the recommendation.
- 3. Unofficial transcripts or a letter from the student's college or university stating the student's current major and GPA.
- 4. A recent picture in WWII uniform of the student.

Deadline: July 1 **Notification**: August 1

An article highlighting the student will be published in the Society publication, The Edge, after the scholarship is awarded.

Review:

A committee consisting of an Allied, an Axis, and a Commonwealth WWII HRS member, preferably involved in education, will review and give recommendation to the Society board of directors for awarding the scholarship based on the submitted applications.

Directions: The Fox River Trolley Museum is located on Illinois Route 31, three blocks south of State Street in South Elgin, IL.

- at Fox River Trolley Museum, 365 South LaFox Street (Illinois Route 31), South Elgin, IL 60177
 From Chicago and the east: Take the Northwest Tollway (I-90) or US Route 20 west to Elgin. Exit on Illinois 31 southbound and follow posted detour at Spring Street (South Elgin).
- From the west and northwest: Take the Northwest Tollway (I-90) or US Route 20 east to Elgin. Exit on Illinois 31 southbound and follow posted detour at Spring Street (South Elgin).
- From the south: Take Illinois Route 59 north to Illinois Route 64. Turn west on 64 to Illinois Route 31 in St Charles. Take 31 north to the museum.

Prohibited Vehicles/Items: All WWII vehicles including tracked vehicles are welcome, weather conditions permitting; tracked vehicles may be limited to the gravel road and battle field. Smaller vehicles such as Jeeps, Motorcycles, Kubels & Lightweight Trucks may drive on the grassy areas. A static vehicle honor display area has been established for all attending vehicles. Boats and other period water crafts such rafts are also welcome on the Fox River, but should contact us first prior to bringing out. River depth is only 2-3 feet in the vicinity of the museum.



2ND ANNUAL SALUTE TO VETERANS WWII EVENT

Bristol, Indiana WWII Re-enactment March 1945

Schedule

Thursday, May 12th, 2016

1:00 PM - Setup begins, re-enactors are allowed to register and bring in their POVs.

11:00 PM – Setup Closes, re-enactors will have to wait until the following morning to enter the event grounds, register, and set up.

Friday, May 13th, 2016

8:00 AM - Setup re-opens, re-enactors are allowed to register and bring in their POVs.

11:00 PM – Setup closes, re-enactors will not be allowed to bring in their POVs past this point. Any re-enactors with POVs on the event site must move them to the re-enactor parking lot at this time.

12:00 AM – Registration closes, re-enactors will not be allowed to enter the event grounds until the following morning.

Saturday, May 14th, 2016

6:00 AM – Re-enactors are allowed to once again enter the event grounds to register and set-up.

No POVs are allowed in from this point onward and must be parked in the re-enactor lot.

8:00 AM - Re-enactors will be forced awake and notified that they must be present at the S&A meeting.

9:00 AM – The Safety and Authenticity Meeting begins, along with the battlefield session in which everyone will attend. It will last roughly 45 minutes.

10:00 AM - The event is open to the public.

10:30 AM - Weapons demonstration on the battlefield.

11:30 AM - Public cleared from camp areas and re-enactors begin staging for first battle.

11:45 AM - No public are allowed to enter the grounds as the battle is about to begin.

12:00 PM – First battle begins, Commonwealth vs. Germany, March 1945 (Commonwealth Victory)

[If enough commonwealth are not present at the event, this will be a US vs. Germany battle with a German victory]

1:15 PM - USO Demonstration.

2:15 PM - Infantry Tactics Training for Kids.

3:30 PM - 2nd Battle, United States vs. Germany, March 1945 (US Victory).

5:00 PM - Event closes to the public.

Note* Re-enactors will not be allowed to bring in their POVs after the event closes to the public.

7:00 PM – USO-style dance for re-enactors and guests.

Sunday, May 15th, 2016

9:00 AM - Church Services at "T" Junction in small field behind Allied Wooded camps.

GoFundMe Campaign

Salute the Armed Forces Continues to Raise Monies for Veteran University The Nonprofit Searches for a New Location to Offer Programs

(Burr Ridge, IL) March 16, 2015—Since it began its GoFundMe Campaign in December, Salute the Armed Forces (STAF), a nonprofit dedicated to helping veterans make a smooth transition from military to civilian life, has raised \$740 to fund Veteran University. Its goal is to raise \$10,000 and needs the public's help in reaching that threshold.

Veteran University focuses on building and construction trades and takes veteran students from the classroom to work site job readiness in a matter of weeks. Because the university program is not currently eligible for Veterans Affairs (VA) assistance, Ed LeTourneau, founder of STAF, relies on private corporate sponsors and donations. Therefore, he is asking the public to donate on the Veteran University's GoFundMe website: https://www.gofundme.com/salutetarmedforces. The donations will go toward staffing, specialized equipment and building operations.

"Meeting this GoFundMe goal is so critical," says LeTourneau, a Burr Ridge resident. "Our work has a very positive effect on a veteran and his and her entire family. We wish we could do more but we have limited resources. We are very thankful for all the support we've received so far in this campaign. We have helped many vets get on a course for employment that very often leads to a happy and stable life. Just knowing they have a job or that special job interview can be a real game changer."

In a new development, LeTourneau also launched a search to find a new location for the university. The nonprofit lost its lease for its Waukegan facility in January.

"STAF regrettably has lost its lease and was forced to close its Waukegan location," he says. "STAF will continue all of its service to veterans from its Burr Ridge headquarters. Plans are currently underway to find a new location for Veteran University. We strive to continue being a reliable resource for Americans veterans to find the right career path and look forward to our future."

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
